2023 Student Aid Program Information and Application

Skrungloo Farm, Inc.

Skrungloo Farm, Inc. is a private foundation that was established in 1986 to provide direct aid, assistance, and/or services to the residents of, in order of priority, Sandwich, Center Harbor, Moultonboro, Carroll County, Belknap County, and New Hampshire. This includes providing scholarships for individual residents to educate and better themselves in order to build a stronger community.

Student Aid Program

Skrungloo Farm, Inc. accepts applications for scholarships from students who are legal residents of the United States residing in the State of New Hampshire. Applicants must demonstrate financial need, academic merit, and other non-academic factors such as community service, school activities, and work experience.

Who Should Apply?

New Hampshire students who plan to enroll at an accredited post-secondary institution are eligible to apply. Students may be enrolling in a vocational school, technical school, or a 2- or 4-year college or university. The school may be in-state or out-of-state. However, students must be enrolling on a half-time (6+ credits) or full-time basis, not part-time. Graduate students are also eligible to apply.

Selection Criteria

Students are selected to receive awards based on financial need, academic merit, and other non-academic factors such as community service, school activities, and work experience. Highest priority is given to students with the fewest financial resources and to vocational/technical students, and who reside in the following geographic areas, listed in order of priority: Sandwich, Center Harbor, Moultonboro, Carroll County, Belknap County, and then the entire State of New Hampshire.

Awards are made through a blind process, where financial need and merit are considered without knowledge of a student's identity. Due to the blind process, please do not write your name on each of the pages and do not include photos.

Determining Financial Need

Skrungloo Farm, Inc. does an assessment of financial need using a formula similar to those used by federal student aid programs. In addition, awards finalists may be expected to provide information about their college aid packages so that Skrungloo Farm, Inc. awards can be specifically tailored to meet individual need. Awards are made to fill need gaps in a financial aid package, or in some cases, to reduce student loans.

Types of Awards Available

Awards may be made in the form of grants, low-interest loans, honor loans, or combinations of all of the above. The type of award offered is primarily based on the foundation's budget. It is the foundation's goal to make awards whenever possible, considering the other goals, functions, and purposes of the foundation and related expenses.

Award Disbursement

Award payments are sent to the student's school at the beginning of the fall semester, upon receipt of enrollment verification. Checks are made co-payable to the student and the school.

Re-Application

Students may continue to apply for funding for as long as you continue to be a New Hampshire resident attending an accredited institution. Even if you applied in a previous year and were turned down, you may reapply for consideration in another year. A completed application is required each year you apply.

Application Process

This application booklet contains 12 pages. If you do not have all 12 pages, please contact us at the email address or phone number below. The application must be fully completed and returned to Skrungloo Farm, Inc., postmarked no later than May 31, 2023. In addition to the application and essay answers, an official transcript, recommendation, and copy of your completed 2022 or 2023 FAFSA Form or SAR must be included with your application. We strongly suggest that transcripts, recommendations, and the FAFSA Form accompany your application upon its submission. Material sent separately may not be matched to your application and the application could be considered incomplete.

Deadline

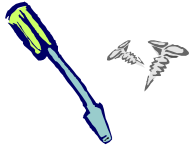
The deadline for the application is May 31, 2023. All applications must be postmarked or hand-delivered no later than that date. Faxed or emailed materials will not be accepted. Applications postmarked or hand-delivered after the May 31, 2023 deadline will not be accepted. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted. No exceptions will be made if a school mails your documents late. It is the student's responsibility to make sure the application is complete and all attachments are included.

It is important to note that all materials, including your official transcript, applicant recommendation, financial form, and your 2022 or 2023 FAFSA Form must be mailed together (not sent separately) to Skrungloo Farm, Inc. in time for the May 31, 2023 deadline. To meet this deadline the application and all supporting materials must be postmarked or hand delivered no later than May 31, 2023. We strongly urge you to get your application in the mail well before the deadline. We do not accept emailed or faxed materials, and applications or materials received after the deadline will not be reviewed.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

- Completed 2023 application including signatures on pages 4 & 9, as well as a completed Family Financial Form—see Part 4 (pages 8 & 9).
- Completed FAFSA Summary Report Form or Student Aid Report. **[Attachment A]**
- Answers to the three essay questions—see Part 5 (page 9). **[Attachment B]**
- If you are a high school senior, Part 6 (page 10) must be completed by a school official.
- An official high school or college transcript—see Part 7 (page 10). **[Attachment C]**
- Recommendation from an authorized individual—see Part 8 (pages 11 & 12). **[Attachment D]**

- Please do not staple, tape, or place your application in a binder.
- Do not include photos.
- Do not put your name on each page.
- Do not include tax forms.

We are not able to accept photocopies, emails, or transcripts stamped "unofficial." If you are submitting multiple scholarship applications that require official transcripts, you will need to request an original, official transcript for each application.
